



2020-2021 Frostbiting: Pier Walkthrough¹

Action Items

Waiver: Please sign a new waiver **before the first time you come frostbiting**. [Click here for the waiver](#). We do not have waiver signing devices on site this year.

Symptom Notifier: Please fill out our symptom notifier **each Saturday** before arriving at the pier. [Click here for the symptom notifier](#).

Electronic Sign-in: We will be sending out the electronic sign-in with the Frostbiting recap each week. We ask that you [complete your sign-in](#) by **8pm on Friday evenings**.

Safety-related Changes from Prior Frostbite Seasons

This frostbiting season there will be no access to the boathouse. Therefore, we'll be looking for our racers to make adjustments in the following ways:

Changing in your car - There will be nowhere to change clothing on the pier, so we are hopeful that racers can arrive dressed to sail, or able to change in their cars. Limited nearby parking will be available on both Piers 3 and 4 to make this easier (see below.)

No hanging-out before or after racing - Once changed, we are asking that sailors stop shortly at the Front desk (a table at the top of the ramp) to double check their boat rotation and check-in with our Frontdesk staff so we know you've arrived.

Sadly, we can't host post-race gatherings this year, but The Anchor (outdoor bar at the base of the pier) is open! Feel free to head over for a (socially distanced) beer.

Lifejackets - Lifejackets will not be provided each week. If you are unable to purchase a lifejacket for the season, Courageous will assign you one for the season that you are responsible for bringing each week. We are unable to wash lifejackets and therefore cannot accommodate sailors needing a new lifejacket each week. A lifejacket sign-up sheet is available on the pier with our Frontdesk staff. A small deposit of \$20 will be held for the season and you're asked to bring it to and from home each race day.

Personal Belongings- Regretfully, there is *no storage of personal belongings* anywhere on site. Please leave it at home, in the car, or bring it with you sailing.

Restrooms - There will be porto-pottys available for use on the pier, with no running water competitors are asking to use hand sanitizer located in the restrooms.

Changes from this Summer

Here are some of the ways Frostbiting will be different from our Adult Program sailing this past season.

- **Hand sanitizer stations** - Hand sanitizer stations will replace our hand washing sinks, as we do not have running water on the pier in the winter.
- **Wearing a face covering while sailing** - Governor Baker's [Order 55](#) requires each sailor to wear a face covering at all times.

On the pier

Look for our signs, they are there to help guide you through the new process and remind you of critical new steps including:

1. **Have you completed your symptom notifier?** This must be completed before arriving.
2. **Masks on**
3. **Sanitize your hands**

On your boat

Getting to your boat: It is hard to give personal space on the gangway, therefore we will be viewing it as "one way". When someone is already walking, please yield to them at the top or bottom of the ramp until they go by.

Tying up and Derigging - give space where possible while you're on a dock, and while derigging alongside another boat.

Hand Sanitizer - Will be provided on your sailboat. We encourage sailors to use this as needed.

Parking on Pier 4

11 Vehicles per week will have parking access on the pier. This is exactly half of our anticipated skipper/crew teams and therefore, we will be doing an on/off rotation by *team* each week. Teams have been assigned a parking cohort that can be referenced [here](#). Our team will be present each week helping to direct you where to park but the rough guidelines include:

The cohort rotation will begin with cohort A on Saturday 11/14/20 and alternate from there each week. We'll be including reminders about which cohort has the pier in our preview email each Friday.

- Only one vehicle per team
- The gate will be open for approved teams between 10:45-11:30. Teams arriving after 11:30 will need to find alternative parking.
- We must keep the fire line (the straight line between the entrance of the pier and the end of the pier) clear at all times
- Please display your parking pass on your dash with a clearly legible name and phone number in the event we need to contact you.
- Vehicles are asked to be parked in a uniform way

- During colder winter months, following snowfall, parking may become more limited due to snow banks. We will do our best to continue to accommodate the fleet however it cannot be guaranteed.
- The car representing the team each week should be logged during the skipper check-in on Fridays.
- Any car not logged, or not included in the rotation, may be towed and may force a suspension of racing while we locate the owner.

Teams on the pier:

It will be up to the skippers and crews of each team to organize amongst themselves which sailor will be parking on the pier that day. Skippers and crew should use their vehicle as a space to change and get ready.

Teams not on the pier:

Parking on [Baxter Road/Pier 3](#) has been approved by our neighbors but cannot be guaranteed for all individual sailors each day. Please make sure to only park in the row of spaces on the left side (facing the water) as you drive onto Baxter road.
